## Lip Stick / Make-up / Mascara

#### Description

We can usually blame this stain on kids playing grown-up except we frequently see it in homes with no children present. Most sources will respond to similar treatment. However, some fine powder make-up will require careful vacuuming.

#### **Tools Required**

- Extraction equipment
- Handi Brush, tamping brush or spotting spatula
- White cotton towels
- Wall paper steamer or steam iron

#### **Chemicals Required**

- Bridgepoint RedZONE
- Bridgepoint Avenge Neutral Spotter
- Bridgepoint P.I.G. or OINK
- Bridgepoint Solvent Clean

#### **Procedures**

NOTES: If previous cleaning attempts have been made, be sure all chemical residues have been rinsed from the carpet.

For best results, use fresh products and apply them to carpet that is as dry as reasonably possible.

- 1. Remove as much as of the staining material as possible. This can be accomplished with vacuum, **Hand-Brush**, spotting spatula or edge of a spoon.
- 2. Apply **Avenge Spotter** around the outside of the stained area. This will keep the stain from spreading as it is dissolved.
- 3. Apply P.I.G. or OINK to the effected area.
- 4. Work in with tamping brush, **Handi Brush** or spatula to assure thorough penetration. Tamp spot into towel.
- 5. Rinse and extract with hot water.
- 6. Apply Solvent Clean on white towel thoroughly wiping affected area.
- 7. If color remains, Apply **RedZONE**, agitate to insure penetration. Apply heat using steam iron or wallpaper steamer. Check progress every 30 seconds. Stain should be gone in 2 to 3 minutes.
