Mold

Description

Mold is a living organism that can cause permanent damage to natural fibers even after the stain is removed. Be cautious as damaged fabrics may be weak enough to rip or tear. Mold requires moisture and a food source to live, grow. The presence of mold often indicates other underlying problems that must be addressed. Be sure to find the source of the moisture and advise that it be corrected. Significant amounts of mold pose a health threat to sensitive people.

Tools Required

- Extraction equipment
- **Spot Claw** or **Flash Spotter**
- **Handi Brush** or spotting spatula
- White cotton towels

Chemicals Required

- Bridgepoint **Urine Stain Remover**

Procedures

1. Carefully and thoroughly vacuum affected area. Gently agitate with **Handi Brush** or other soft brush to improve vacuum efficiency.
2. Apply **Urine Stain Remover** to an inconspicuous location to test for possible color loss.
3. If there is no color loss, apply **Urine Stain Remover** to the affected area.
4. Gently work into the carpet using a **Handi Brush** or spotting spatula.
5. The mold stain will gradually fade as the product works. This may require anywhere from a few minutes to several hours.
