Teriyaki Sauce

Description

It sure makes chicken taste good, but what happens when it gets spilled on carpet? It can contain soy sauce, ground ginger, garlic powder, brown sugar, honey, and cornstarch.

Tools Required

- Warm water extraction/rinsing capability
- Gum Getter or spotting spatula
- White cotton colorfast towels
- Trigger Sprayer

Chemicals Required

- Bridgepoint Avenge Neutral Spotter
- Bridgepoint RedZone

Procedures

- 1. If possible, thoroughly extract area using warm water or blot up as much of the spilled material as possible with your cotton towels.
- 2. Apply **Avenge Neutral Spotter** straight evenly across the stain with a flip top applicator. For large contaminated areas, use trigger sprayer.
- 3. Agitate gently with spatula to assure penetration.
- 4. Extract area thoroughly with warm water. If extractor is not available, blot area with warm water.
- 5. If discoloration remains, apply **RedZONE** part A and part B straight evenly across the stain with a flip top applicator. For large contaminated areas, use trigger sprayer.
- 6. Allow area to dry completely.
